Position Title: Community Engagement Intern

Background

Located on unceded Musqueam territory, the Centre for Sustainable Food Systems (CSFS) at UBC Farm is a unique research center that aims to understand and fundamentally transform local and global food systems towards a more sustainable, food secure future. The CSFS at UBC Farm is a living laboratory committed to finding solutions to both local and global challenges facing food systems sustainability and translating solutions to improve personal, community, and environmental health.

The Career Development Internship aims to engage UBC students with their local food system and create opportunities to experience the working environment of a food sustainability focused organization. Interns work alongside food systems practitioners and faculty to increase their understanding and knowledge of food systems work, from organic agriculture to food production methods, food-focused community engagement, and business management.

The UBC Farm is engaged in a number of programs and events that aim to enhance community food literacy and to encourage advocacy on issues of public concerns including environmental stewardship, healthy diets and lifestyles, and social development. The Community Engagement Intern plays a vital role in managing community outreach events and programs by: seeking out and attending weekly outreach events on- and off-campus, coordinating and recruiting outreach volunteers, helping create outreach material. The Community Engagement Intern is an enthusiastic and dedicated UBC Farm ambassador who is always ready to inform the community about the UBC Farm's role in food system sustainability.

Interns are expected to enroll in the Career Development Internship course (LFS 496 - 3 credits) twice: once in the Summer semester and once in Winter 1 semester. At the end of the 26-week program, students will be eligible to receive course credit towards their UBC degree.

Duties

The Community Engagement Intern will work alongside the farm supervisor and other farm staff on the following tasks:

- Researching and attending events that will increase student and community members' awareness and interactions with the UBC Farm;
- Recruit, train and retain volunteers for outreach events;
- Help create program specific outreach materials;
- Contribute to community engagement data collection and reporting.
